

# Tuition & Scholarships

To qualify for the Good Shepherd Scholarship or the Shamrock Scholarship, families will apply annually through the FACTS Grant & Aid Management portal. Each family who qualifies will receive the scholarship for all enrolled students.

Families with more than 3 children in any Catholic School in the Lincoln Diocese will only pay tuition for the first 3 children enrolled, granted they apply for the Family Cap Scholarship through FACTS Grant & Aid.
